
About the Cloverbud Program:

The 4-H Cloverbud program is designed as a non-formal approach to developing the confidence, social skills, decision making abilities, subject matter knowledge, and physical skills of kindergarten through second grade youth. As youth begin their 4-H Cloverbud experience, they take part in a unique blend of activities and opportunities specially designed for their age level.



Who Can Be a Cloverbud?

Membership eligibility for the 4-H Cloverbud Program begins when a child has reached the age of 5 as of January 1st of the current 4-H year. Individuals should check with the Montrose Extension office to discover the best Cloverbud clubs.

How Cloverbuds Tarticipate: Toverbud


