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




There are also a few changes to the horse project rules for our County Fair Horse Show, so please read them carefully in the 2025 Exhibitor Guide which is available at the Extension Office.


MESA COUNTY FAIR MARKETING CLASS

Release: Warning: Under Colorado Law, an equine professional is not liable for injury to or death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherentrisks of equine activities, pursuant to Section 13-21-119, Colorado Revised Statutes. I (we), the owner and/or exhibitor, hereby request to enter the show indicated and agree to abide by the bylaws, standing rules, judging and show rules in the Colorado 4-H Horse Show Rule Book, Mesa County Fairgrounds and River Riders 4-H Club. I (we), hereby release Mesa County and River Riders 4-H Club, and its members and employees, and its and their officials, officers, members, employees agents and or volunteers from any loss to myself, employees, agents, horses and/or equipment while attending and/or participating in this show. The provisions contained herein are hereby made a part of this entry agreement.

Statement of Responsibility: I (we), the owner and/or exhibitor agree to exhibit the above horse at my own risk and subject to all rules and regulations in the Colorado 4-H Horse Show Rule Book, Mesa County, its commissioners, fair board of directors, organizers and employees. I further agree that if I suffer personal injury and/or damage, or loss occurs to me or my vehicle or equipment I may have or send with my horse, I will not hold the River Riders 4-H Club or any other persons connected with this event responsible, nor will I make claim against them.



HELMET WAIVER OF LIABILITY

(Pursuant to Resolution MCM 01-2001-135)

The undersigned <u>**Releasor**</u>, on behalf of <u>**The Minor**</u>, his/her heirs, assigns, agents, as well as those taking by or through them, for and in consideration of being allowed to use the Mesa County Fairgrounds, hereby releases Mesa County, Colorado, its insurers and insureds, its officers, officials, agents, employees, and volunteers, whether elected or appointed, agents, heirs, predecessors, successors, administrators, assigns, (hereinafter referred to as Releasee) for and from any and all liabilities of whatsoever kind and nature, including but not limited to, constitutional claims, 42 U.S.C. '1983 claims, and any and all claims for damages from any and all actions, cause of actions, whether sounding in tort or negligence, contract or otherwise, claims, demands, compensatory and punitive damages, loss of service, loss of consortium, compensation, costs, attorney fees, and expenses, arising from or, in any way arising out of any and all known and unknown, foreseen and unforeseen, injuries, losses, damages, and liabilities which they may now or hereinafter have, resulting from the Minor's use of the Mesa County Fairgrounds.

The Releasor declares that it is his/her intention by this document to completely and fully waive any claims he/she may have or which could be made against the Releasee, regardless of any tolling or non-suit provisions. Releasor has carefully read this document and knows its contents, and the Releasor has signed it freely and voluntarily. The terms of this document are not simply a recital of facts, but contractual promises made by the Releasor in his/her capacity as the Minor's parent or guardian. Releasor warrants that no promise or inducement has been offered, and that the Releasor is legally competent, authorized, and/or appointed to execute this document and accept full responsibility therefore.

Spring Gather Rules 2025 Open Ranch Horse Show

4-H Ranch Horse Show Rules will apply with the following exceptions:

1. Entry

- a. This is an all-breed open ranch horse show.
- b. Contestant may enter the same horse in more than one division, but it has to be entered above lowest division contestant is qualified for. 14-18 riders who want to ride in two divisions, must ride in open division.
- c. Contestants who want to ride only in a division higher than they are qualified for, must ride in the 14-18 division or open division.
- d. Contestant may enter more than one horse in the same division.
- e. Points go to the horse.
- f. Must show in all five classes to place and receive awards.
- g. If entering more than one horse in a division, **another contestant** may show the additional horse or horses in the halter class.
- Entries must be in and paid by April 15, 2025. Entries not received by April 15, 2025 will be assessed a \$25 late fee.
- i. Entries for each day will be limited to the first 40 riders in and paid. No reservations without payment.
- j. No refunds will be given after entry deadline date, April 15,2025.
- k. Refunds will only be given if there is a paid backup entry willing to participate prior to the entry deadline.
- I. Entries may be transferred only with notification to show management prior to deadline date, and only with show management approval after deadline date.

2. Divisions

- a. Open (Level III rules and patterns) for participants who have won the adult division, professional horsemen and women, those who are actively showing in ranch horse shows, and those who have shown in the youth 14-18 division.
- b. Adult (Level II rules and patterns) for adults who are new to showing in ranch horse shows.
- c. 14-18 (Level III rules and patterns)
- d. 11-13 (Level II rules and patterns)
- e. 10 and under (Level I rules and patterns)

3. Classes

- a. Ranch Cutting, (Exhibitor will ride slowly into the herd, cut and hold one animal out, the call off turn back riders, drive the cow between the fence and cone then around the pen and back into the pen. Exhibitor has 2 ½ minutes to complete his run.)
- b. Individual Cow work
 - i. Open riders and 14-18 ride as level III (Level III/IV riders will box, fence, and circle or rope. Riders are allowed 3 minutes to complete the class.)
 - ii. All others, ride as level II (Level II riders will box for 50 seconds. When notified by the announcer, the rider will take the cow down one side of the arena past the halfway mark and perform a responsive square stop. Rider must not attempt to stop or turn cow once it has gone down the fence. Riders are allowed a minute and a half to complete the class/run.)
- c. Ranch Trail
 - i. See division patterns
- d. Ranch Riding
 - i. See division patterns
- e. Ranch Halter
- Additional Rules:
 - a. Division high point will be calculated from placings in each class.
 - b. Youth (18 and under), must wear helmet or have a signed Mesa County Helmet Waiver.
 - c. Youth in the 10 and under division shall be allowed to ride curb bits with two hands.
 - d. Numbers must either be on horse or rider while horse is in arena.
 - e. All entry fees, less expenses, will go to River Riders 4-H Club.
 - f. No dogs will be allowed on premises.
 - g. 4-H Score sheets will be used and posted as soon as possible after classes.
 - h. Running a cow into the fence will be considered abuse of cow with a zero score and dismissal from arena.



It is the responsibility of every 4-H member to ensure that proper care is taken of their animal(s) according to acceptable methods of good animal husbandry, as set forth by Colorado State University Extension and the Colorado Department of Agriculture. A healthy animal requires sufficient food, water, shelter, and appropriate health care. Cruel and inhumane treatment or neglect is prohibited in the Colorado State University Extension 4-H Program. Specific animal husbandry guidelines and humane training methods are provided in the 4-H manuals.

It is necessary for the local county Extension office to know the location of all 4-H animal projects. The Colorado 4-H project recommendation for primary care states that "4-H members will provide primary care and continuous care of the project animals." Primary care is defined as the 4-H member making the decisions for and/or providing the care, handling, and training of their animal project most of the time." Any primary care exemption must be approved by the county Extension specialist/coordinator. With advanced notification, 4-H members and guardians acknowledge facilities and animal welfare checks may be conducted at any time by Extension specialist/coordinator.

4-H animal project participants are required to complete an animal care form each 4-H year. This document does not imply ownership of animal(s) listed. It denotes your responsibility to care for the listed animal(s). Please check the box for each species you will be participating in this 4-H year. To exhibit at the Colorado State Fair 4-H contests, ownership rules must be followed.

Owner shall have the right at any time, in person or by authorized agent, to inspect the horse and determine if said horse is being properly cared for and in good health. The title and ownership of the leased horse shall be and remain in the name of the Owner. Lessee shall not sell, mortgage, or encumber this leased horse in any manner whatsoever. Lessee shall not assign this lease nor sublease the horse covered hereby

If the leased horse should at any time become missing, lost, seriously injured, sick, or dead, the Lessee shall immediately notify Owner by telephone and subsequently by mail.

Owner shall not hold Lessee liable for any serious injury or death of the horse arising from events not resulting from negligence on the part of the Lessee or the Lessee's agents. Lessee shall hold the Owner harmless for any injury to persons or damages to any property caused by the leased horse

No modification of this lease shall be binding unless in writing and executed by the parties hereto.

Below are some additions to the Exhibitor Guide (available later in the month) that may pertain to you NOW if you are doing beef uploads this month.

This is not to be considered a complete list of changes to the Exhibitor's Guide. You will need to read the guide in its entirety to assure yourself that you are up to date on the rules pertaining to your projects for this fair year.

RULE 9: Family nominated animals

A. Family members may nominate the same animal in beef, swine, sheep, and goat projects, as long as:

a. each family member must nominate a primary owned animal

b. the family nominated animals don't exceed 1 per every 2 family members

c. the upload fee of \$5 per head is paid by EACH member uploading the family nominated animal.

d. the family nominated animal MUST be individually declared by a family member online in fairentry.com by the fair entry deadline of June 13th,2025 at 4pm.

e. if the family nominated animal is a beef entry, ALL family exhibitor names MUST be on the brand inspection as owners of the animal at time of beef tag in/weigh in date of February 1st, 2025.

RULE 10: In all situations where an animal upload is required, the minimum information that must be included before the nomination will be approved is:

- A. Name of the animal
- B. Breed of the animal
- C. Gender of the animal
- D. A picture of the animal
- E. A picture of the animal with the exhibitor
- F. Ownership document showing ownership by the youth exhibitor; this document may be:

a. a Bill of sale

b. a Breeding supplement showing birth of the animal from youth or youth's family's animal

c. a Handwritten statement transferring ownership from someone to the youth

G. If animal is a beef entry, the upload MUST also have a brand inspection in the youth's name



Important additions to the Exhibitor Rules for the 2025 Mesa County Fair (continued)

RULE 10 (continued)

H. If animal is a swine entry, the upload MUST also include a completed Mesa County 4-H/FFA Swine Registration Sheet available on the Tri River Extension website:

https://tra.extension.colostate.edu/4-h/mesa/mesa-county-forms/ and the ear notches of the animal

I. If animal is a sheep or goat entry, the upload MUST also include the scrapies tag number of the animal

J. If animal is a poultry entry, it MUST also include in the "ANIMAL NAME" slot the breed, the variety, and the name of the bird (IN THAT ORDER) AND in the the "COLORS AND MARKINGS" slot the 'variety' (APA variety such as white, buff, silver laced, barred, etc which can be found in the American Standard of Perfection book)

K. If animal is a rabbit entry, it MUST also include the tattoo identifier

These required items MUST be part of the upload prior to the upload deadline for that animal type.

RULE 11: Animal nomination upload deadlines for the 2025 Mesa County Fair (ALL DEADLINES ARE AS OF 5PM) are:

Market Beef - Friday, January 31st Fowl Production Layers - February 16th Breeding & Show Poultry - April 16th Market Sheep & Goats - April 30th (Notify office if purchasing an animal between 5/1-5/7) Horse, Dog, Cat - May 1st (state deadline) Market and Breeding Swine - May 2nd Breeding Sheep, Breeding Goats, Breeding Rabbit, Breeding Beef - May 14th Market Rabbits - May 15th Market Poultry - June 11th
