Enrollment/Re-Enrollment Time

We are looking forward to an exciting new year of 4-H fun with all our new and returning 4-H members and leaders.

Our tentative date to begin accepting enrollments and re-enrollments is **October 15, 2025**. Enrollment fees for members 8-18 in the Tri River Area is **\$50.00*** for the first two projects and \$5.00 for each additional project after the first two. Cloverbuds (ages 5-7) can enroll for \$30.00. Enrollment for club a project leaders is free.

All ages are based on December 31, 2025



**This fee is for re-enrollments received online on or before February 2, 2026. All regular member re-enrollments received after February 2, 2026 will be assessed an additional late fee of \$50.00. Late fees do not apply to Coloverbud enrollments or Leader enrollments.*

Important info for those with members who wish to travel out of county:

The TRA Policy is as follows:

Parents of members who want to travel to out of county events (i.e. District 10, LDC, State Conference, etc) will need to enroll as 4-H leaders and travel with their child(ren) as a chaperone to said event.

Enrollment as a leader is required due to the fact that you will need to pass a background check in order to attend events as a chaperone. Please be aware that enrollments for new leaders do take some time to be approved because of the background check process. This means that it is better that you enroll *early* as a leader as opposed to close to the event. Anyone who has not completed their background check will not be allowed to chaperone.





How To Enroll in 4-H



Enrollment Process for 2025-2026 - **NEW MEMBERS & LEADERS**

1. Access the 4HOnline system at: <https://v2.4honline.com>
2. You will need to set up a family profile by selecting the "I need to set up a profile" button. You only need to set up one family profile per household.
3. Once your family profile is set up, you will then add individual youth and adults. As you enter information, please look it over carefully to make sure it is correct. Incorrect information can create problems so be sure to do this double-check!
4. Once all profile information is entered and double checked press "submit enrollment".
5. The Extension Office will then receive a notification that you have enrolled. Please note: Enrollments will not be activated until your participation fees have been paid.
6. Fees in the Tri-River Area for regular 4-H enrollment is: \$50.00 for the first two projects, \$5.00 for each additional project after the first two. Cloverbud (ages 5-7) enrollment fees are \$30.00.

Enrollment Process for 2025-2026 - **RETURNING MEMBERS & LEADERS**

1. Access the 4HOnline system at: <https://v2.4honline.com>
2. Please **DO NOT** establish another family or member profile on 4HOnline because you are already in the system!
3. Access your family profile and update your information. As you tab through your information, please look over it carefully to make sure it is correct. Incorrect information can create problems so be sure to do this double-check!
4. Once all profile information is entered and double checked press "submit enrollment".
5. The Extension Office will then receive a notification that you have enrolled. Please remember: Enrollments will not be activated until your participation fees have been paid.
6. Fees in the Tri-River Area for regular 4-H enrollment: \$50.00 for the first two projects, \$5.00 for each additional project after the first two. Cloverbud (ages 5-7) enrollment fees are \$30.00.

Enrollment Facts:

1. You are not a member or volunteer leader in the Colorado 4-H Program until you have an active status in 4HOnline.
2. 4-H members and leaders cannot register for an event/contest until their profile is active.
3. Adult Volunteers are required to be screened through Hire-Right Inc.
4. Colorado 4-H and 4hOnline work closely to monitor and ensure the highest level of protection for information stored in the system. Neither Colorado 4-H nor 4HOnline shares or sells any personal information to third party vendors without your permission or knowledge.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW!!

As we prepare for the 2025-2026 4-H year, please review the following policies regarding club participation, member in good standing status, & officer responsibilities.

- Enrolling through 4-HOnline - instructions on how to do this are in this newsletter. Members must have been 8-18 years of age as of 12/31/25.
- Enroll in at least 1 (one) project per year.
- Sign the member code of conduct - this is done when enrolling in 4-HOnline and is located under the member profile information section. Be sure to read it!
- Pay applicable county 4-H fees - Delta County 4-H charges \$50 for the first two projects and \$5.00 for each additional project after that. You are not actively enrolled in the Delta County 4-H Program until you have enrolled online and paid all fees.
- Club Requirements - members must attend at least 70% of meetings, give a 4-H related demonstration or speech arts presentation, and participate in at least one 4-H sponsored community service activity to remain in good standing.
- Complete county requirements - this includes attending a Meat Quality Assurance training (for livestock members); complying with county fair rules; meeting deadlines, etc.
- Complete a record book for each project enrolled in during that 4-H year.
- Find out what your project completion requirements are for each project you are enrolled in.
- 4-H Club Presidents (or a designated representative) are **required** to attend each regular 4-H Council meeting held during the 4-H year. Meeting times, dates and locations for these meetings will be emailed out to all 4-H families.

Failure to meet these requirements will result in a project being deemed incomplete, and the member not be eligible to participate in the Delta County Fair.

Why does this matter? Being a member in good standing is necessary for participating in county, state, regional and national events and is often a prerequisite for eligibility for 4-H scholarships.

Consequences for violating any part of the Code of Conduct may include, but are not limited to: removal from participation in the event in which the code of conduct has been violated *at the individual's expense*; sanctions on participating in future 4-H events; forfeiture of financial support for the event; removal from offices held, etc. Behavior outside of 4-H activities can affect member in good standing or volunteer in good standing status.

Attention Parents of Shooting Sports Members.....



The Delta County 4-H Program is badly in need of more certified shooting sports leaders. Certified leaders are necessary to hold practices and fun activities like the Invitational Shoot. In short, if we don't have leaders the kids miss out!

How do you become certified? There will be a training in the spring (probably in Rifle but that is to be determined) that you can go to. Several different disciplines are offered so you should have a choice of what you would like certification in.

A Variety of Clubs

As you know, not everyone's schedule is the same. At times it can be tricky to find a 4-H club that fits into yours. The fact that Delta County has several different clubs offers you a variety of options. Some clubs meet weekly, some monthly, some meet 4 times a year. Some clubs do numerous fundraisers and community service activities and others do fewer. Different people want to get different things from the 4-H program.

If you find that your 4-H club does not work for you, contact the Delta 4-H Extension Office for a list of clubs and club leaders in your area. Feel free to contact these clubs and find out about their schedules and activities. If you do decide to switch clubs, you need to contact the leader of your new club to let him/her know you want to be in that club. In addition, you need to be sure to contact the club leader of the club you are leaving and make them aware of the switch. Be sure to let the office know so we can make the switch in 4-HOnline.
